




HIV/AIDS Health Administration Organizational Structure 143 FTEs







Services within the Activity	The Strategic Information Division (SID) is primarily responsible for the collection, analysis and security and confidentiality of client level disease surveillance data. Although providers are required to report infections to the health department, investigative surveillance staff members have authority to access, review, and copy information from medical records for the purposes of public health surveillance and disease interruption. This is a service provided to reduce the burden of reporting by providers as well as conduct data quality assurances. The dissemination of aggregated surveillance and program data is meant to inform programs and policies with the intent of reducing new infections, increasing access to care, reducing health disparities, and creating a coordinated response. Surveillance data is also used to initiate partner services activities; to provide counseling, testing, and linkage to care to those newly diagnosed; and to identify individuals that may have fallen out of care in order to initiate provider reengagement. SID provides technical oversight to HIV prevention, care and treatment programs through routine, rapid and robust data analysis for programmatic and policy decisions, as well as monitoring and evaluation (M&E) of HIV, STD, Hepatitis and TB prevention, care, and treatment outcomes (quality management). This includes the provision of technical assistance in all HAHSTA data collection, data quality and data use activities and serves as the overall responsible party (ORP) for security and confidentiality of client level data.




