

A PROPOSED RESOLUTION

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IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

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To declare the existence of an emergency, with respect to the need to amend Title 50 of the District of Columbia Official Code to permit former Advisory Neighborhood Commission 2C residents who are now Advisory Neighborhood Commission 6E residents to retain use of their Zone 2 residential parking permits.

RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this act may be cited as the “Advisory Neighborhood Commission 6E Residential Parking Permit Exception Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2014”.

Sec. 2. (a) There exists an immediate need to amend Title 50 of the District of Columbia Official Code to permit former Advisory Neighborhood Commission 2C residents who are now Advisory Neighborhood Commission 6E residents to retain use of their Zone 2 residential parking permits.

(b) Redistricting resulted in the Advisory Neighborhood Commission 6E being landlocked by Wards 1, 2, and 5. No other area in the District of Columbia has parking zones surrounded by three different wards.

(c) The imposition of Zone 6 parking on residents in this Advisory Neighborhood Commission would create undue hardship where parking is already scarce due to the proximity of the Walter E. Washington Convention Center and numerous religious activities.

(d) New York Avenue serves as the southern boundary of Advisory Neighborhood Commission 6E to the south. It is not practical for residents to park their vehicles south of New York Avenue, as there are few residential parking spots and many residents would be forced to regularly walk across a major roadway to their residences.

Sec. 3. The Council of the District of Columbia determines that the circumstances enumerated in section 2 constitute emergency circumstances making it necessary that the Advisory Neighborhood Commission 6E Residential Parking Permit Exception Emergency Declaration Resolution of 2014 be adopted after a single reading.

Sec 4. The resolution shall take effect immediately.
