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17 To officially designate, on an emergency basis, the entire public alley system within Square 376
18 bounded by 9th Street, N.W., 10th Street, N.W., F Street, N.W., G. Street, N.W., in Ward
19 2, as McGill Alley to honor the prolific 19th Century Washington architect, James H.
20 McGill.
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22 BE IT ENACTED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this
23 act may be cited as the “McGill Designation Emergency Act of 2017”.

24 Sec. 2. Pursuant to sections 401, 403, and 421 of the Street and Alley Closing and
25 Acquisition Procedures Act of 1982, effective March 10, 1983 (D.C. Law 4-201; D.C. Official
26 Code §§ 9-204.01, 9-204.03, and 9-204.21) (“Act”), and notwithstanding the requirements of
27 sections 421(b) and 421(f) of the Act (D.C. Official Code §§ 9-204.21(b),(f)), the Council
28 officially designates the entire public alley in Square 376 bounded by 9th Street, N.W., 10th
29 Street, N.W., F Street, N.W., and G. Street, N.W., as shown on the Surveyor’s plat in the
30 committee report for the McGill Court Designation Act of 2017, as approved by the Committee
31 of the Whole on June 20, 2017 (Committee print of Bill 22-59), as “McGill Alley”.

32 Sec. 3. Transmittal.

33 The Council shall transmit a copy of this act, upon its effective date, to the Mayor, the
34 District Department of Transportation, and the Office of the Surveyor.

35 Sec. 5. Fiscal impact statement.

36 The Council adopts the fiscal impact statement in the committee report for the McGill
37 Alley Designation Act of 2017, as approved by the Committee of the Whole on June 20, 2017
38 (Committee print of Bill 22-59), as the fiscal impact statement required by section 4a of the
39 General Legislative Procedures Act of 1975, approved October 16, 2006 (120 Stat. 2038; D.C.
40 Official Code § 1-301.47a).

41 Sec. 6. Effective date.

42 This act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by the
43 Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), and shall remain in effect for no longer than
44 90 days, as provided for emergency acts of the Council of the District of Columbia in section
45 412(a) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 788;
46 D.C. Official Code § 1-204.12(a)).
