On Tuesday, July 2, 2019, Councilmember Charles Allen, Chairperson of the Committee on the Judiciary and Public Safety, will convene a public roundtable on Proposed Resolution 23-0333, the "District of Columbia Board of Elections Karyn Greenfield Confirmation Resolution of 2019". PR23-0333 would appoint Karyn Greenfield to the Board of Elections for a term to end July 7, 2022.

The Committee invites the public to testify or to submit written testimony. Representatives of organizations will be allowed a maximum of five minutes for oral testimony, and individuals will be allowed a maximum of three minutes. Witnesses should bring **twenty copies** of their written testimony and, if possible, also submit a copy of their testimony electronically in advance to judiciary@dccouncil.us.

For witnesses who are unable to testify at the roundtable, written statements will be made part of the official record. Copies of written statements should be submitted to the Committee at judiciary@dccouncil.us. **The record will close at the end of the business day on Tuesday, July 9.**
