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IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

To amend, on an emergency basis, the Law to Legalize Lotteries, Daily Numbers Games, and Bingo and Raffles for Charitable Purposes in the District of Columbia, the Day Care Policy Act of 1979, and Neighborhood Engagement Achieves Results Amendment Act of 2016 to dedicate all net revenue from District-operated sports wagering, with the exception of revenue certified in the approved Fiscal Year 2020 budget for Fiscal Years 2020, 2021, 2022, and 2023, split evenly between the Early Child Development Fund and the Violence Prevention and Intervention Fund.

BE IT ENACTED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this act may be cited as the “Sports Wagering Dedicated Revenue Emergency Amendment Act of 2019”.

Sec. 2 Section 311(a) of the Law to Legalize Lotteries, Daily Numbers Games, and Bingo and Raffles for Charitable Purposes in the District of Columbia, effective May 3, 2019 (D.C. Law 22-312; D.C Official Code § 36-621.11(a)), is amended by adding a new paragraph (3) to read as follows:

“(3) All net revenue from District-operated sports wagering, whether from taxing licensed retailers, from contracts with vendors operating Office of Lottery and Gaming mobile and web-based sports wagering, or from licensed sports wagering retailers, with the exception of revenue certified in the approved Fiscal Year 2020 budget for Fiscal Years 2020, 2021, 2022,

36 and 2023 shall be split equally between the Early Child Development Fund, established by
37 section 5143 of the Birth-to-Three for All DC Clarification Amendment Act of 2019, passed on
38 2nd reading on June 18, 2019 (Enrolled version of Bill 23-209) and the Violence Prevention and
39 Intervention Fund, established by section 104 of the Neighborhood Engagement Achieves
40 Results Amendment Act of 2016, effective June 30, 2016 (D.C. Law 21-125; D.C. Official Code
41 § 7-2413).”

42 Sec. 3. Section 11b of the Day Care Policy Act of 1979, effective September 19, 1979
43 (D.C. Law 3-16; D.C. Official Code § 4-410.02), is amended by adding a new subsection (c) to
44 read as follows:

45 “(c) There is established as a special fund the Early Child Development Fund “Fund”,
46 which shall be administered by Office of the State Superintendent of Education in accordance
47 with paragraphs (1), (2), and (3) of this subsection.

48 “(1) All special purpose revenue and dedicated taxes collected from section
49 311(a)(3) of the Sports Wagering Lottery Amendment Act of 2018, effective May 3, 2019 (D.C.
50 Law 22-312; to be codified at D.C. Official Code § X-XXX) shall be deposited into the Fund.

51 “(2) Money in the Fund shall be used to support the cost of care and the teacher
52 salary scale increases pursuant to subsections (a) and (b) of this section.

53 “(3) The money deposited into the Fund but not expended in a fiscal year shall not
54 revert to the unassigned fund balance of the General Fund of the District of Columbia at the end
55 of a fiscal year, or at any other time.”.

56 Sec. 4. The Neighborhood Engagement Achieves Results Amendment Act of 2016,
57 effective June 30, 2016 (D.C. Law 21-125; D.C. Official Code § 7-2411 *et seq.*), is amended by
58 adding a new section 104 to read as follows:

59 “Sec. 104. Violence Prevention and Intervention Fund.

60 “(a) There is established as a special fund the Violence Prevention and Intervention Fund
61 (“Fund”), which shall be administered by the Mayor in accordance with subsections (c) and (d)
62 of this section.

63 “(b) Revenue from the following sources shall be deposited in the Fund:

64 “(1) “All special purpose revenue and dedicated taxes collected from section
65 311(a)(3) of the Sports Wagering Lottery Amendment Act of 2018, effective May 3, 2019 (D.C.
66 Law 22-312; to be codified at D.C. Official Code § X-XXX) shall be deposited into the Fund;
67 and

68 “(2) Local funds appropriated by the District.

69 “(c) Money in the Fund shall be used to fund the activities of the Office of Neighborhood
70 Safety and Engagement (“ONSE”), including:

71 “(1) Providing financial incentives to eligible participants, which may be issued
72 by ONSE or an agency designated by the Mayor;

73 “(2) Providing grants to eligible community organizations; and

74 “(3) Appropriate overhead or administrative expenses related to the ONSE and
75 the Fund.

76 “(c)(1) The money deposited into the Fund but not expended in a fiscal year shall not
77 revert to the unassigned fund balance of the General Fund of the District of Columbia at the end
78 of a fiscal year, or at any other time.

79 “(2) Subject to authorization in an approved budget and financial plan, any funds
80 appropriated in the Fund shall be continually available without regard to fiscal year limitation.”.

81 Sec. 5. Fiscal impact statement.

82 The Council adopts the fiscal impact statement of the Budget Director as the fiscal impact
83 statement required by section 4a of the General Legislative Procedures Act of 1975, approved
84 October 16, 2006 (120 Stat. 2038; D.C. Official Code § 1-301.47a).

85 Sec. 6. Effective date.

86 This act shall take effect following approval by the Mayor (or in the event of veto by the
87 Mayor, action by the Council to override the veto), and shall remain in effect for no longer than
88 90 days, as provided for emergency acts of the Council of the District of Columbia in section
89 412(a) of the District of Columbia Home Rule Act, approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 788;
90 D.C. Official Code § 1-204.12(a)).
