A BILL

IN THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

To amend, on a temporary basis, the Attorney General for the District of Columbia Clarification and Elected Term Amendment Act of 2010 to expand the Attorney General’s grant-making authority for crime reduction and violence interruption activities.

BE IT ENACTED, BY THE COUNCIL OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, That this act may be cited as the “Attorney General Grant-Making Authority Temporary Amendment Act of 2019”.

Sec. 2. Section 108c(a) of the Attorney General for the District of Columbia Clarification and Elected Term Amendment Act of 2010, effective May 10, 2019 (D.C. Law 22-313; D.C. Official Code § 1-301.88f(a)), is amended by striking the phrase “grants not to exceed the total amount of \$360,000 for” and inserting the phrase “grants for” in its place.

Sec. 3. Applicability.

This act shall apply as of October 1, 2019.

Sec. 4. Fiscal impact statement.

The Council adopts the fiscal impact statement of the Chief Financial Officer as the fiscal impact statement required by section ~~602(e)(3)~~ 4a of the ~~District of Columbia Home Rule Act,~~ approved December 24, 1973 (87 Stat. 813; D.C. Official Code § 1-206/02(e)(3)) General
