On Thursday, February 7th, 2022, Councilmember Robert C. White Jr., Chair of the Committee on Government Operations and Facilities, will hold a public hearing on B24-0466, the "St. Elizabeths East Parcel 13 Surplus Declaration and Disposition Approval Act of 2021". The public hearing will take place via the Zoom web conferencing platform at 12:00 PM. The stated purpose of B24-0466, the "St. Elizabeths East Parcel 13 Surplus Declaration and Disposition Approval Act of 2021" is to declare surplus and approve the disposition of District-owned real property known as St. Elizabeths East Parcel 13, located at 1100 Alabama Avenue, S.E., and known for taxation and assessment purposes as Lot 850 in Square S-5868.

The Committee invites the public to testify remotely or to submit written testimony. Anyone wishing to testify must sign up at or by phone at (202) 741-8593, and provide their name, phone number or e-mail, organizational affiliation, and title (if any) by <u>the close of business on</u> <u>Thursday, February 3rd, 2022</u>. Witnesses are encouraged, but not required, to submit their testimony in writing electronically in advance to <u>facilities@dccouncil.us</u>. Witnesses will participate remotely via Zoom. The Committee will follow-up with witnesses with additional instructions on how to provide testimony in advance of the proceeding.

All public witnesses will be allowed a maximum of four minutes to testify, while Advisory Neighborhood Commissioners will be permitted five minutes to testify. At the discretion of the Chair, the length of time provided for oral testimony may be reduced.

Witnesses who anticipate needing language interpretation, or require sign language interpretation, are requested to inform the Committee of the need as soon as possible but no later than five (5) business days before the proceeding. We will make every effort to fulfill timely

requests, however requests received in less than five (5) business days may not be fulfilled and alternatives may be offered.

The Committee also encourages the public to submit written testimony to be included for the public record. Copies of written testimony should be submitted by e-mail to facilities@dccouncil.us. The record for this public hearing will close at the close of business on Monday, February 21st, 2022.
